The Position

The Program Assistant is responsible for working directly with youth as well as handling some of the administrative tasks of the Oakwood Techniques Performing Arts programming at Oakwood Community Center in a manner that supports youth arts education and development in a trauma responsive manner. The assistant will work directly under the Program Coordinator and as part of the Oakwood Community Center team and will promote the activities of the Center.

Salary

This is part-time. The pay rate is \$18-\$20/hour.

- Document students' daily experience (ie. attendance, behavior, workshops attended, etc.)
- Ongoing parent engagement & communication
- Additional Community Center duties as assigned including but not limited to: help with mailings, basic building maintenance, community outreach, etc.

- Administrative work as assigned by Youth Programs Coordinator
